- **Outcomes:**
  - Participants can engage in social conversations with neighbors, store owners, and community leaders.

- Increased participation in community events and activities.
- Strengthened relationships with local support networks.

### **Goal 5: Enable Academic Success and Continued Education**

- **Objective:** Refugees will gain foundational skills for continued learning, including the ability to navigate educational environments.
- **Outcomes:**
  - Participants are able to understand instructions in academic settings (e.g., reading syllabi, understanding classroom directions).
  - Ability to communicate effectively with teachers and school staff.

### **Program Structure & Methods**

- 1. Initial Assessment:**
  - Conduct a language assessment to determine each participant's level of English proficiency (beginner, intermediate, advanced).
  - Identify specific needs and learning goals (e.g., job readiness, school enrollment, social interactions).
- 2. Customized Curriculum:**
  - **Beginner Level:** Focus on essential vocabulary, basic grammar, and simple conversation skills.
  - **Intermediate Level:** Expand vocabulary, work on grammar rules, and introduce topics related to employment, education, and daily life.
  - **Advanced Level:** Focus on improving fluency, conversational skills, and writing proficiency. Begin preparation for specific goals (e.g., resume writing, job interviews).
- 3. Language Practice Opportunities:**
  - **Conversation Circles:** Weekly informal sessions for practicing speaking and listening with native speakers.
  - **Field Trips:** Organize trips to local businesses, banks, schools, and government offices to practice English in real-life situations.
- 4. Cultural Orientation:**
  - Workshops to introduce refugees to American culture, including customs, work expectations, and community norms.
- 5. Family and Community Support:**
  - Provide outreach to families to encourage language learning at home.
  - Connect refugees with local resources, such as housing support, healthcare, and legal aid.
- 6. Use of Technology:**
  - Provide access to online language-learning platforms (e.g., Duolingo, ESL apps) for additional practice.
  - Create a website or social media group for program updates, additional learning materials, and community support.
